5th Grade Parent/Student/Staff Transition Surveys Fall 2025

As part of our 5th grade implementation transition plan, we promised to provide surveys to gain feedback with what is/isn't working well with our plan. The initial survey was sent to 5th grade parents via Infinite Campus Messenger on October 9 with a "Last Call" reminder on October 16. The teachers shared the survey with students via Schoology on October 10 with a "Last Call" reminder on October 16. The survey was due for both groups on October 17 at 3pm. The Whiteford Administrative met with the 5th grade teachers on October 21 to gain their feedback as well as look at the student and parent data. Feedback from these surveys was used to determine appropriate adjustments to better serve our 5th graders as they transition from the elementary building.

Plan Adjustments based Upon Stakeholder Feedback (10/21/25)

Students need greater access to resources (Behavior Interventionist, Counselor, Interventionist). 1a: Create a regular schedule for these resource personnel to be at the MS daily or weekly. Admin and 5 th grade teachers got together to discuss when they feel students have the most need. We decided that having support directly after lunch would be most beneficial. Marsh, Hillard or Brossia are walking over with 5 th grade after recess for access. We try for everyday! 1b: Consider how to make 5th grade students aware of how they access resources, maybe through a Google Form. Admin and 5 th grade teachers discussed doing a concern jar or a Google document for students to express their concerns. After feedback from 5 th grade students, we have decided to create a Google form to post on teacher Schoology pages for students to request support. The Google form has been created and will be shared with 5 th grade teachers/students on 11/5/25. 1c: Hiring of a Title Aide that will cover 2nd grade, which would allow for another aide to support 4th/5th grade part-time. Students are asking for a snack by 8:30am each morning, so we need to make sure students have access to breakfast at MS. • 2a: Option 1: Have the 5th grade teachers do a walking field trip to the MS/HS cafeteria after 8am, so students can learn about the staffing, process, and where they can sit. Also, ensure that students can get breakfast after the 8am bell, and they would bring it back to the classroom to eat. Option 2: Consider a remote breakfast opportunity where it is brought to the 5th grade classrooms by 7:55am, and students would be allowed to eat until 8:15am in the classrooms. • Scott spoke with The Nutrition Group leadership about both options, and after discussion, we will start with Option 1. (10/21/25) Scott communicated with lunch personnel and 5th grade teachers about the decision to go with Option 1. Walking field trips will begin the week of 11/4-11/7 for all 5th grade students. (11/3/25) • 2b: If Option 2, then at the beginning of 2nd semester, take all 5th grade students on a field trip to the breakfast area to meet cafeteria staff, Chris A., Ken G., etc., so they will become more familiar with accessing breakfast in the MS/HS cafeteria.
